

## "THE CHARACTER STUDY"



## MADE EASY



### March is Women's History Month.

Join us in celebrating some of the remarkable women who have left a lasting mark on human history, specifically the Women of the Bible. March would be the perfect month to start a character study. Suggestions for female characters to study would be Elizabeth, the virgin Mary, Martha, Mary Magdalene, Esther, Priscilla, Ruth, Eve, Rebekah, Rahab, Bathsheba, and Deborah. Studying a particular character in the Bible can often give insight into what they experienced during their time in history and how we can apply those lessons to our own lives.

STEP 1:
Choose your
character

Step 2: Search your concordance and other Biblical resource books for instances in the Bible when your character was portrayed. I recommend making a mind map with your character at the center, with the central ideas coming off of that.

Step 3: Remember to use the "5 W's" when studying: Who is the author or character, Why are they significant to the Biblical story, When does the story take place, Where does it take place, and What is the main theme?

Step 4: After answering the "5 W's", you can begin to dig deeper into the life and times of the character. What else was happening in the character's life during the time period they lived? What were some of the significant cultural practices that may have affected the decisions they made? Write these down in the way that helps you learn best.






Daylight Savings begins on March 10th.



## **Calling All Volunteers**



## **SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINES**

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. - Romans 12:2

I ran across a retired high school principal. He was in the midst of praising his wife. And what was he praising her for? Sharing with him the gift of routine and discipline. He said that when he was a young man – full of energy – he had a hard time sitting still, he lived life all over the map. Now married for nearly 40 years, he gets up and goes to bed on a regular schedule. Breakfast is always at 5:30am, lunch is at noon and supper is at 6pm. His wife gave him the gift of routine. "Routine will save your life," he said.

I can't agree more. Routine – and I'll use a harder word, "Discipline" – opens the doors to focusing on who and what is important: My relationship with God and my neighbor.

Paul wrote to the Romans, ". . . so that you may discern what is the will of God – what is good and acceptable and perfect." Discerning someone's will assumes an active relationship with that person. How can this happen with God? Through discipline.

That is a little tough for me, because I'm not a very disciplined person. I fight with myself with the most basic things, like going to bed and getting up at a regular time. I don't know why, but it's the way I'm wired. I get bored and distracted. Even as I get older, the bratty little kid or the daydreamer inside me struggles to grow up, and I will struggle with basic disciplines until God fully heals this sinner.

So why fight it? Why strive to discipline yourself? Because discipline, routine, opens the door to life and to discerning the will of God. In fact, we're disciplining ourselves every day. We pursue disciplines – strange disciplines – to find the life our soul craves – sports stats, movie binges,

YouTube shorts, other social media, retail therapy, and a hundred other daily habits we employ in our effort to escape or search for meaning.

This Lenten season, we're taking this seriously. We need discipline. Spiritual disciplines foster our connection with God which deepens our understanding of who we are as human beings. The disciplines of confession, prayer, fasting, solitude, silence, simplicity, study, prayer, worship, service, fellowship and submission (a list summarized by Dallas Willard in his book, "The Spirit of the Disciplines".) may not sound fun or earth-shattering or entertaining, but they're solid. They are the vegetables and meat portion of the meal that lead to the sweetness of dessert later.

I come to the spiritual disciplines as an undisciplined person. Here is what I learn over and over again: reading the Bible, spending time thinking through what I read in the Bible (meditation), spending time in solitude and prayer – talking through this with God and listening, then meeting with my fellow Christ-following friends (fellowship) . . . this has saved my life in so many ways. No, this isn't the occasional wild thrill I sometimes crave. This is daily bread from Jesus. This is grace. It provides the dose of joy and common sense I need to live in freedom.

My lack of discipline has taught me one more thing: Begin today. Yesterday has passed. If you missed a day in your daily devotional reading, page to today's reading. If life pulled you away from saying your prayers and listening, do it today. Do it today, even if for a short time. Don't heed the words, "Oh, I'll do it tomorrow." God is not hidden. He is here for you now. Join with Him. You'll be glad you did.

## **USE YOUR WORDS**

This week, we are very much planning and preparing for our First Communion Classes for 5th graders. And we are praying that all involved are becoming very capable Christians. We want them to mature into their own faithful lives. And that got me thinking ...

Our daughter-in-law can be heard at least a few times a day telling one of the toddler grandchildren to "use their words" when those small, beautiful children who are just learning to communicate sometimes get frustrated or excited or whatever and they use grunts, groans, screams, whimpers or hand motions to try to tell us something. As parents who love our children, we want to help move them from immaturity to maturity and part of that process is getting them to articulate what they are feeling or thinking. To truly grow, kids must learn how to use their words in the communication process.

What's true in parenting is also true in our congregations. If we really want to mature in our outreach effectiveness, we must use our words. I recently had a conversation with a woman who told me that she never really talks about God with her neighbors, but she simply lets them see Christ in her. (Ok, good first step.) But she had no intention and felt no obligation to try to share the Gospel message with them verbally. Of course, we want to live the message. And, yes, we want to build loving, relational bridges with those around us. We must let our little lights shine with the way that we live. But without words, we are not sharing the message that can save them from a hopeless life and Christless eternity. As Romans 10:14 reminds us, "How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they

have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?"

I know there's lots of reason to stay quiet. I hear a lot from parents whose children do not attend Sunday school or church that they want their children to make the decision when they are able to.

But if they haven't been taught about Jesus, how will they make the choice for Jesus?

Some other reasons might be laziness or immaturity, but beyond all the excuses lurks the real reason for their Gospel silence....fear. The fear of rejection/of losing friends keeps us silent. As a result, we're not willing to pay the price of following Jesus by risking relationships by bringing the Word of God up. Down deep inside we're afraid to rock the relational boat by sharing the very exclusive message of Jesus. We don't want to bring discomfort to peers because that may bring discomfort to us.

But in Mark 8:38 Jesus made it crystal clear to his disciples that, "If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels." Don't be ashamed of Jesus. Don't be ashamed of his words. Communicate these words with a humble heart and a listening ear but communicate them...with your life AND with your lips.
